## **What next?**

Over the next week or so we will take time to digest the information and guidance. We will be working hard to ensure that we put everything in place for September to ensure that our school is as well prepared as possible for all pupils to return full time. In previous correspondence we shared with you that we will not be **reopening school until Thursday 3rd September 2020 at the earliest**. This approach will mean that when we do welcome your child back, we will do so secure in the knowledge that everything is in place to ensure that they can quickly start to feel happy and excited about their learning and we can support them in the best ways possible. We know that for many of you, sending your child into school in September 2020 may be a daunting prospect but it is important that you know the extent of the work taking place in the background. Our school has remained open to key worker children and those deemed vulnerable throughout lockdown and, since June, we have accommodated Year 6. Throughout this period we have learned a great deal about effective social distancing measures and constantly sought to refine and improve what we are doing - this approach means that with every additional child we have become more and more secure in how we operate with Coronavirus in the world. In short, we will be ready when September comes and we will be doing everything in our power to make sure school is a fun and exciting place to be.

**Over the next few weeks we will outline details of how we think Rednal will operate and also provide some of the details of the new curriculum we will be implementing.**

## **Before and After School Provision from September**

We are taking a growing number of calls from parents about before and after school provision for September. We will provide further guidance on this in the coming weeks but we thought it pertinent to give you an understanding of the dilemma the school faces around this topic. The government guidance clearly states that schools should 'maintain bubbles being used during the school day'. This means that it will not be possible to cater for the numbers of children from across the school that we have previously had in before and after school club, and we would encourage you to start to investigate/seek alternate provision in preparation for September.



### Worries
